The program acts as a matchmaker between established businesses and professionals who volunteer their expertise as members of a 'custom-fit' advisory board.

I am fortunate to have a group of professionals who have been so dedicated to the success of my company." Limitless International was named to the elite 2010 Inc. 500 list.

Founded in 2003, the SBDC at UCF's Advisory Board Council is an economic development program funded by Orange County Government. Since its inception, the program has assisted 125 companies and has had more than 450 area professional volunteers. designed for second-stage companies, offering a confidential setting for top executives to discuss vital issues, opportunities and trends with a group of peers.

The SBDC at UCF serves an eight-county area that includes Brevard, Flagler, Lake, Orange, Osceola, Seminole, Sumter, and Volusia counties and maintains six satellite service centers.
